HeartSong Celebration –

This glass mosaic design depicts Miriam and Moses joining the people in celebrating their freedom on the shores of the Red Sea. In portraying the people dancing and singing as a reflection of their love and gratitude, it additionally serves as a reminder of how we can properly show our appreciation for all we have to be thankful for in our own lives.



Spanning five feet in diameter, this glass mosaic contains between 7,000-10,000 pieces of glass. Its creation involved extensive hand painting (some pieces individually required firing in a kiln four to five times each), as well as numerous types of mirrors and specialty glass. (Examples - Note the Catspaw glass used for the turtle shell, and the Drapery glass used to simulate both the ruffled feathers on the swan and the hair on the dog. These are similar to Tiffany glass, used by the artist in Victorian times for his windows and mosaics.) The glass used for the rays of light was laminated on mirrors. Additionally, the composition includes imported Venetian glass mosaic tiles and hand blown imported antique glass.
