## Visions of Hope –

This unity picture combines the desires of all who long for an Israel, and world, at peace. The lithograph's main quote comes from Theodor Herzl, "If you will it, it is not a dream...." The portraits of Herzl on the left, and Elijah on the right, signify the secular and the religious. Between them, the people praying at the Western Wall, with the Hebrew shalom woven into their bodies, represent the shared goal of peace for Israel.



A few examples of David's unique symbolism may be found in the portrayal of Herzl, whose head may be seen as partially composed of an eagle (also described in Elijah's prophecy). Within this majestic bird, Isaiah's prophecy, referencing the wolf, lamb and the little child leading them, may also be found.

The lower part of Herzl's profile is made up of a Torah and contains the biblical quote which is also written on the Liberty Bell: "You will proclaim liberty throughout the land."

A depiction of people praying at the Western Wall, with a Hebrew "shalom" woven into their bodies, can be found between the two main figures. This is representative of all people who share our vision of peace.
